

In the three-day period ending, Monday, February 23, 2009 at 4:30 p.m., 1.53 inches of rain fell in Oakland, bringing our percent of normal precipitation to 90% for the period July 1, 2008, through February 23, 2009.

For the remainder of the week there is a possibility of scattered rain showers through most of the week. Late Wednesday and into Thursday appear to have the greatest chance for precipitation, with Friday into Saturday looking relatively dry. Another storm system will move into Northern and Central California late on Saturday giving the area another chance for rain going into the latter part of the weekend.

There were a total of 61 weather-related calls received over the three-day period.

As rains resume for the season, crews continue to inspect and clean inlets and storm drains and to patrol and monitor the Lake Merritt area and hills for any drainage-related issues in order to avert problems. There were crews on standby for sandbag distribution, with 182 sandbags and 25 feet of plastic sheeting distributed from the Municipal Service Center (none from the Shepard Canyon Corporation Yard) over the three-day period.
